Q4-

How many hours per week are students expected to be actively engaged with online learning?

- **Grades 6-8:** 30 minutes/day for each class. A class that meets every day will require students to complete 2 ½ hours of work/week. Every other day classes will require 1-1 ½ hours of work/week. Each Friday will be used for students to make up assignments or access teachers through google classroom, email, or teacher office hours. A list of instructional/professional Junior High email addresses is located at the end of this plan.

What will online learning look like for students?

Students will have multiple opportunities each week to engage with each classroom teacher. Students will:

- Spend time learning new material.
- Watch video lessons.
- Participate in class discussions.
- Complete assigned work and activities .
- Access teacher office hours/reach out via email or google classroom for support and guidance on the new learning.

Student Expectations:

- Login to Google Classroom **at least one time** per day to complete assignments or communicate with their teacher.
- Submit completed work on Google Classroom as requested by the teacher.
- Join hangout video chats facilitated by the teacher for classroom discussions.

Grading:

To continue to hold high standards for instruction and student learning while navigating our extended school closure, we have developed the following grading guidance. This guide will outline key decisions that support compassionate and careful grading of student remote learning assignments. The guide is for use during our school closure. Should we return to school during the 19-20 school year, the adopted grading policy may be reenacted.

- **Avg.** - Q1 through 3 and midterms - Q4 should **BENEFIT** student grades.

Evidence of Learning = Student has demonstrated learning of essential curriculum based on what was taught and assigned.

Not Yet Learned = Student has not completed assignment, or work completed does not yet demonstrate learning of essential curriculum. Students will be given the opportunity to redo and resubmit work to demonstrate learning.
