NO deliveries will be accepted. Hudson Junior High School assumes NO responsibility for flowers or gifts that are delivered to students during the school day. Students are not to have commercial food delivered to the school. No outside “fast” food will be allowed into the cafeteria. Parents/friends/etc. may not drop off food from outside sources (i.e., McDonalds, Subway, Taco Bell, etc.). This is to better ensure the security of the school as well as to minimize disruptions to the school day. Food delivered to students by outside delivery companies will be confiscated. **If a student opens an outside door to allow an outside food delivery, they will face disciplinary consequences as that creates a security risk.** If you have questions, please contact your student's school administrator.

- If a student forgets their lunch it must be dropped off at the main office and may be obtained during the student’s assigned lunch period.
- Food and/or drink may only be consumed in the cafeteria during school hours. Water may be permitted in classrooms at the teacher’s discretion.

## Cafeteria Guidelines for Students

- Students must report directly to the cafeteria for their lunch period. Students must have a pre-written pass to eat lunch other than the cafeteria.
- Be courteous to the cafeteria staff and the hall monitors.
- Use appropriate language and behavior.
- Wait patiently for service at the end of lunch lines.
- Do not wander through the halls and the lobby.
- Do not throw food or other debris.
- Keep all food, beverages and snacks in the cafeteria at all times.
- After eating, pick up after yourself.
- Use safe judgment while engaging in outdoor activities.
- When outside, stay within the boundaries set by the designated monitor.
- Stay in the designated area or in the cafeteria until the bell rings. Do not crowd the cafeteria exits and/or lobby.

Students who choose not to follow the guidelines will receive consequences from the lunch monitor and/or building administration.

## Public Relations Use of Directory Information
